# I love to fear the Lord

"Serve the LORD with fear and rejoice with trembling." -PSALM 2:11

When you think of loving fear, what comes to mind? Maybe a scary or suspenseful movie, riding a rollercoaster, skydiving, or being a dare-devil. This view of fear is for entertainment. If fearing the Lord meant living in constant terror of God and what He might do to you, then where would the love of fear be?

Recently the doctor put me on a strong medication, the kind that you would be better off not reading the warnings (if you know what I mean). I anguished over the possible side effects for a day or two. Then praying with a friend, the Lord reminded me that "He (God) holds the keys." God could have called me home many times before. God was reminding me that if I fear Him, I have nothing else to fear.

My son asked me once, "Dad, can we be buds? Can I call you, 'Bud?' " Gently, I responded to him,

"No, son, you get to call me something so much more than that. You get to call me 'Dad!' If you called me 'Bud,' you might forget that I am 'Dad' and that I am in charge." "Bud" would have changed the nature of our relationship. We get to call our Heavenly Father "Abba" which means "Daddy." How awesome is that? Fear of God helps us not to forget our place.

"Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire." -HEBREWS 12:28-29

When we read a verse in the Bible that talks about fearing God, there can be a tendency to see it in one of two lenses. We might see fear as being terrified or we might see fear as meaning reverence and deep respect. Actually, fear of the Lord is a combination of the two.

"God is a consuming fire" so even for the believer, he or she never wants to forget that God is God. He is the



Creator of the universe, the One who holds all things together. He is the One who decides to whom and where we are born. God decides the number of days we will live and whether we will be in heaven or hell. God is holy and hates sin, (but loves the sinner) and He brings holiness to completion(for the believer) in the fear of the Lord. (HEBREWS 1:3, JOB 14:5, ACTS 17:26, LUKE 12:5, 2 COR. 7:1)

"Don't be afraid," Moses answered them, "for God has come in this way to test you, and so that your fear of Him will keep you from sinning!" -EXODUS 20:20

In this verse the people of God are at the foot of the mountain and hear God in the form of thunder and the loud blast of the ram's horn. They see lightning and smoke. They stand at a distance, terrified that God would destroy them. God is showing them that they (we) should know who He is and what He can do. Moses said. *"Don't be afraid."* When we respond to God with humble obedience, we have no need to be afraid of Him.

The Bible speaks of many blessings and rewards that come from fearing the Lord. It prolongs life, brings our salvation, fulfills the desires of our heart, grants favor, mercy, His loving kindness, gives us strong confidence in Him. These and so much more are promised for those who fear Him openly. If our pursuit is the reward, then it is not the fear that God calls the believer to at all.

"A simple casket for a simple man with a profoundly simple message of God's love. That's what visitors will see when they pay respects to Billy Graham, the North Carolina-born evangelist who traveled the globe during his lifetime sharing the Gospel with some 215 million people." His pine casket was carried by his grandsons.

The casket was made in 2006 by inmates of the Louisiana State Pennitentiary in Angola, LA. It is lined with a mattress pad and has a simple wooden cross on top. It cost around \$200 to make.

On Wednesday and Thursday this week he will lie in state at the U.S. Capitol Rotunda before returning to NC for the funeral which will be live-streamed and on FOX News TV beginning at 10 am. on Friday, March 2.

## Words from Rachel Scott's father to members of Congress after she was killed in the Columbine shooting

"Since the dawn of creation there have been both good and evil in the hearts of men and women. We all contain seeds of kindness or the seeds of violence. The death of my wonderful daughter, Rachel Joy Scott, and the deaths of that heroic teacher, and the other eleven children who died must not be in vain. Their blood cries out for answers.

"The first recorded act of violence was when Cain killed Abel out in the field. The villain was not the club he used. Neither was it the NCA, the National Club Association. The true killer was Cain, and the reason for the murder could only be found in Cain's heart.

"In the days that followed the Columbine tragedy, I was amazed at how quickly fingers began to be pointed at groups such as the NRA. I am not a member of the NRA. I am not a hunter. I do not even own a gun. I am not here to represent or defend the NRA because I do not believe that they are responsible for my daughter's death. Therefore I do not believe that they need to be defended. If I believed they had anything to do with Rachel's murder, I would be their strongest opponent.

"I am here today to declare that Columbine was not just a tragedy—it was a spiritual event that should be forcing us to look at where the real blame lies! Much of the blame lies here in this room. Much of the blame lies in the pointing fingers of the accusers themselves. I wrote a poem just four nights ago that expresses my feelings best. This was written way before I knew I would be speaking here today.

> "Our laws ignore our deepest needs, Your words are empty air. You've stripped away our heritage, You've outlawed simple prayer. Now gunshots fill our classrooms, And precious children die. You seek for answers everywhere, And ask the question 'why?'...

"Men and women are three-part beings. We all consist of body, mind and spirit. When we refuse to acknowledge a third part of our make-up, we create a void that allows evil, prejudice and hatred to rush in and wreak havoc. Spiritual presences were present within our educational systems for most of our nation's history. Many of our major colleges began as theological seminaries. This is a historical fact.

"What has happened to us as a nation? We have refused to honor God, and in so doing, we open the doors to hatred and violence. When something as terrible as Columbine's tragedy occurs—politicians immediately look for a scapegoat such as the NRA. They immediately seek to pass more restrictive laws that contribute to erode away our personal and private liberties. We do not need more restrictive laws.

"Eric and Dylan would not have been stopped by metal detectors. No amount of gun laws can stop someone who spends months planning this type of massacre. The real villain lies within our own hearts.

"As my son Craig lay under that table in the school library and saw his two friends murdered before his very eyes, he did not hesitate to pray in school. I defy any law or politician to deny him that right! I challenge every young person in America, and around the world, to realize that on April 20, 1999, at Columbine High School, prayer was brought back to our schools. Do not let the many prayers offered by those students be in vain. Dare to move into the new millennium with a sacred disregard for legislation that violates your God-given right to communicate with Him.

"To those of you who would point your finger at the NRA—I give to you a sincere challenge. Dare to examine your own heart before casting the first stone! My daughter's death will not be in vain! The young people of this country will not allow that to happen!"
